boxing	a sport in which two people fight each other with their hands, while wearing very large thick gloves (called boxing gloves)	noun	✗

chess	a game for two people played on a board marked with black and white squares on which each playing piece (representing a king, queen, castle, etc.) is moved according to special rules. hockey	a game played on ice, in which players use long sticks to hit a hard rubber disc (called a puck) into the other team's goal	noun	✗
